Parents are reminded to call the office or send a note to the school in the event their son/daughter will be late, absent. or leaving early for a medical or dental appointment. 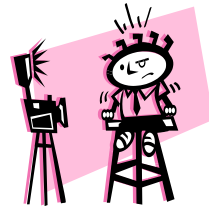
